

2025 Wisconsin Science Festival: Kickoff Party Follow-up Information

Based on the feedback and questions we received after the 2025 Festival Virtual Kickoff Party, we wanted to share a bit more information about the following topics. PROCESS TO SUBMIT EVENTS AND TIMELINE

- APRIL 24: Our <u>event intake form</u> opened on April 24th and will remain open through October 15, 2025
 - Submit details using our intake form for any and all events you would like to be included during the festival (October 16-26). If your event doesn't fall within the dates, but is still in the month of October, we will likely be able to promote it on our website as a pre-/post-festival event.
 - Submitted events receive an automatic email confirmation immediately after submitting. Once we've had a chance to review the submission, we send a formal confirmation to notify of approval.
 - Regular newsletters and reminders will be sent. If you don't already receive our quarterly BeeLine newsletter, subscribe here: wiscifest.org/subscribe.
- **JULY 1:** We begin publishing events to our website after July 1st. Once an event is published, we are still able to make any modifications to the listing. Please notify us directly via email/phone to make any changes to your listing.
- **AUGUST 1:** Events submitted before August 1st will have a chance to request an "Event Host Kit" with swag and other materials to help promote your event as part of the larger Science Festival. Events submitted after August 1st will still have the option to request these materials but supplies are limited and certain items may no longer be available.
- **SEPTEMBER:** Event Host Kits mailed mid-month and distribution process of official WI Sci Fest ads, press release, and other information begins.
- **OCTOBER 1:** Science in a Bag distribution process begins. Libraries accepted as a Science in a Bag site will be notified by early August.
- OCTOBER 16-26: 15th Wisconsin Science Festival!
- **NOVEMBER 15:** Post-event attendance, photos, feedback requested by this date.
- JANUARY 1: Annual report published and shared broadly



SPECIAL OPPORTUNITIES AND RESOURCES

- Wisconsin Science Festival BioBlitz: A BioBlitz allows volunteers, from the public to professionals, to report observations of plants, animals, and fungi seen in Wisconsin during the festival dates. Our friends at the Wisconsin Water Library and Wisconsin Sea Grant, who host the annual Great Lakes BioBlitz in the spring, have assembled an amazing <u>BioBlitz resource guide</u> with all the important information you need to host your own BioBlitz.
