

What is the Wisconsin Science Festival?

First launched in 2011, the Wisconsin Science Festival is a statewide event celebrating science, art, and technology that brings people of all ages across Wisconsin in contact with scientists, educators, artists, manufacturers, and more. The Wisconsin Science Festival aims to inspire and engage us in the enterprise of science and discovery, to cultivate curiosity, and to communicate the power of knowledge and creativity to change our worldview. Events include hands-on science exhibitions, demonstrations, performances, tours, pub nights, workshops, and more.

The Wisconsin Science Festival garners widespread media attention, with some events capturing national press. Visitors from as many as 17 different states engage in events throughout Wisconsin, and the economic impact of the festival typically exceeds \$600K.
